## MEMBERSHIP

A Clubhouse is a community that focus on individual goals, strengths, and assets. Membership is open to anyone who has a history of behavioral health concerns and meets admission criteria. Like a family, there is no time limit on belonging; membership is for life.

Clubhouses do not provide clinical treatment and members are not treated like patients. The staff assists members in locating behavioral health and other professional services. Support is centered around the work ordered day and can include assistance with employment, housing, education, wellness, advocacy and financial aid. Social activities are provided.

## MEMBERS EXPERIENCE

## SUPPORTED AND INDEPENDENT EMPLOYMENT

The Clubhouse assists and supports members to secure, sustain and subsequently, to better their employment.

Members who are working independently continue to have all Clubhouse supports and opportunities available including advocacy for entitlements, assistance with housing, clinical, legal, financial and personal issues, as well as participation in evening and weekend programs.

## TRANSITIONAL EMPLOYMENT

The Clubhouse offers its own Transitional Employment program which provides opportunities for members to work part-time on a temporary job placement in businesses and industries within the community. A defining characteristic of a Transitional Employment program is that the Clubhouse guarantees coverage on all placements during member absences.

The single most important factor in determining placement opportunities is the member's desire to work. The clubhouse staff have the responsibility for selection, training, and placement of members in Transitional Employment, not the employer.



## ORIENTATION

If someone is interested in becoming a member, they can call the Clubhouse for a tour through the Career and Administration Unit. Participation in an orientation gives experience in each of the work units and an understanding of what the Clubhouse has to offer.

To schedule orientation for our Clubhouses call 888-403-1071 and request to schedule an appointment with "open access." During the scheduled appointment request a referral for Clubhouse services. If you already receive services from Compass Health Network, ask your Integrated Health Specialist/CPRC for a referral.
