Substance Awareness Traffic Offender Program (SATOP)

OFFENDER EDUCATION PROGRAM (OEP)

OEP is a 10-hour education program that assists individuals in understanding the effects of drinking on their driving skills, the choices they made that led to their intoxication and arrest, and help first-time offenders consider the consequences of their actions while recognizing other options for the future.

WEEKEND INTERVENTION PROGRAM (WIP)

WIP is conducted in 48-consecutive hours in a restrictive environment over the course of a weekend. This program is designed for repeat or "high risk" offenders and first-time offenders using intensive education, small group processes and individual counseling.

CLINICAL INTERVENTION PROGRAM (CIP)

CIP is an outpatient program designed for people who have not succeeded in making positive choices related to driving while intoxicated. This level of SATOP consists of a 50-hour program, completed in a minimum of five weeks, that includes individual counseling, group counseling, and group education

LEVEL IV OR SERIOUS AND REPEAT OFFENDER PROGRAM (SROP)

SROP is a 75-hour, intensive outpatient intervention program based on the needs of persistent or assessed "high risk" offenders. This program is designed to be completed in a minimum of 90 days. Services will include individual counseling, group counseling, group education, and substance use testing.

Substance use disorders often create problems in relationships, finances, ability to maintain employment, and increases the risk for legal interventions. Our professional assessment team is ready to meet with you to discuss your education or treatment options including:

BRIEF INTERVENTION — LEVEL 1

- Four-week individual program
- Brief screening
- 4 Individual Counseling Sessions

ALCOHOL AND DRUG AWARENESS - LEVEL 2

- Five-week group program
- Brief screening
- 10 hours of group education

CHOICES PROGRAM — LEVEL 3

■ Eight-week combination — group and individual program

PARTNERSHIP WITH FAMILIES (PWF)

PWF is a strength-based, family-driven program that works in collaboration with families, schools, the juvenile justice system, the Children's Division, and other child serving agencies to provide a comprehensive system of care for the child and their family in an effort to keep children and youth safe, at home, in school, and becoming productive members of the community.

WRAPAROUND

With the assistance of an integrated health specialist, children and their families will engage in a process called "wraparound" that will "wrap" needed services and supports around the child and their family resulting in a unique plan of care focused on health and wellness. Wellness plans may include goal-oriented skill building, employment and educational supports, linking to natural and community supports, psychiatry, counseling, primary care, and dental services.

Adolescent Substance Use Disorder / Alcohol & Drug Treatment — NAVIG8

Compass Health Network has two Navig8 programs in Rolla and Columbia. Navig8 provides an eight-dimension approach to serving adolescents from 12 to 17 years old living with substance use disorder.

Navig8 serves adolescents and families whose lives have been impacted by the use of alcohol and/or other substances. The program serves adolescents from ages 12 through 17 and is structured to meet the specific needs of the adolescent and his or her family.

We use a treatment team approach comprised of professionals from all degrees, licensures, and certifications. The treatment team incorporates all significant community and family members needed to support the adolescent's success.

Our program is based on the 8 Dimensions of Wellness (emotional, environmental, spiritual, financial, intellectual, social, occupational, physical) while:

- Focusing on the special needs of adolescents
- Recognizing each person's needs
- Engaging the family
- Ensuring services are client driven
- Challenging the youth to achieve success in family relationships and academic performance.

CRISIS STABILIZATION CENTERS - COMPASS HEALTH

Compass Health Network is unveiling a new project: Crisis Stabilization Centers, which at Compass will be known as Crisis Access Point (CAP). Construction for these centers is

already underway. In total, there will be fifteen locations across the state of Missouri opening tentatively in December of 2021 and into the beginning of 2022. The goal of the Crisis Stabilization Centers is to provide a safe and less costly alternative to divert individuals arrested, away from jail and emergency rooms and into treatment services. These services would allow for further observations, connecting the individual to ongoing care and avoid inpatient admission.

The Crisis Stabilization Centers will be open 24 hours a day, seven days a week, and in the rain or shine. There will be a No Wrong Door entry program that provides rapid access to triage, stabilization services, and linkage to appropriate community services for individuals experiencing a behavioral health crisis. Features of the centers include but are not limited to showers, meals, clothes, medications if needed, and comfortable recliners to sleep on.

No one will be turned away from the Crisis Stabilization Centers, but if other care is necessary, such as hospital care, the individual may be redirected. These centers can serve adults, 18 and over, who are underserved, underinsured and uninsured and dealing with a mental health or substance use crisis. At the end of everyone's visit, they will be given a personalized discharge plan to continue the care outside the door. The Crisis Center will work in collaboration with the local social service providers to develop needed resources and enhance the existing system of care.
